- Trained all teachers, staff, families, and students to use Google Classroom.
- Supported all <u>staff</u> throughout the pandemic, including assisting staff members to obtain COVID vaccinations.
- Instituted personnel procedures and expectations for remote work.
- Communicated frequently with the union to support teachers and address safety concerns.
- Provided <u>full-day synchronous remote learning</u> for all students in grades K-8, more than any other school district in our area.
- Partnered with Family Christian Health Center to provide on-site <u>COVID testing and</u> vaccination for families and staff.
- Provided daily meal distribution for families at each school.
- Provided students with packages of books for summer reading.
